Mother Nature is beautiful but can be powerful and devastating too, as we learnt to our cost recently at The Sanctuary. The severe stormy weather of the night of Saturday 26th January destroyed one of our field shelters and ripped the roof off the on-site mobile home. Our plea for funds to help us repair or replace the shelter was answered by many wonderful, generous people, and we are so very grateful to have such amazing supporters.

One little piece of 'good news' from the media came in recently: according to a poll of 10,000 people for the ITV show 'Britain's Favourite Dogs', Staffies have been named the Number 1 favourite breed. Whilst this is no surprise to SBT owners, this may help to dispel the poor reputation that this breed has, and could encourage more people to think about offering a home to one of the many hundreds in rescue centres up and down the country. We can but hope.

Looking ahead to the rest of the year and fundraising events to help pay the vet bills, we have four dog shows lined up. The first will be held on 7th April at our usual venue of Crofthandy Village Hall, and we look forward to seeing many happy dogs and owners on the day. October 2019 marks the 10th anniversary of the founding of Last Chance Hotel, - so many lives saved since that time, and we trust many more vulnerable creatures will come into our care in the years to come. As most of you know, LCH is an all animal rescue; horses, goats, ex-battery hens and ducks reside at the Sanctuary, and we have small animals such as rats and mice in care, and cats in foster, with specialist team members elsewhere. All our volunteers work hard, many have full time jobs, and we are forever grateful for all these people whose love for animals ensures that we function as a strong, solid team, and a trustworthy and committed charity.

Their aim was to run 48 miles in 24 hours, in rounds of 4 miles every 2 hours. Dan's mum Emma fostered and then adopted Last Chancer 'Eric the Viking', a bundle of fluff with severe fear issues. Eric has blossomed in his new home, and Dan wanted to give something back to LCH as a thank you. Dan is a Personal Trainer and is strong and fit, but this was going to be hard for him. His friend Matt is a triathlete, and his build is more suited to this sort of physical trial. They started at 8pm on 21st December, and by half way Dan was on painkillers. He sent regular updates via Facebook and to Emma, as his friends and family urged him on. A reporter from the local paper was there to record the event, as Dan limped to the finish, the last 12 miles having been particularly difficult. We are blown away by this amazing undertaking by these fab guys, who raised over £1600 for LCH. Thank you so much Dan and Matt, and to all those who donated to their fundraiser, from all the LCH team, on behalf of all the dogs who will now benefit from their 24 hour 'feet of endurance'!

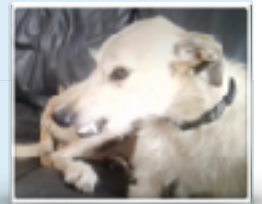

Cats, Cats, Cats

Louisa Blum is LCH's hard working admin lady. As well as having a full time job, she somehow also manages to be a foster mum to the Last Chance Hotel cats, and was finally pinned down to write a little article on how this came about....



I have been part of Last Chance Hotel for over 4 years now, I carry out all the admin for the rescue.

Back in April 2017 a friend in the village knocked on my door to ask me to come and scan a cat that she had found injured in some bushes, to see if it was microchipped for identification. Sadly the cat was not

microchipped and was not in a good way, so I took her to our local vet. The receptionist asked me to call the RSPCA for them to give authority to treat the cat but I called LCH instead and asked if I could sign her in under us. The poor cat had a broken pelvis, the most likely cause being hit by a vehicle. The following day she was operated on and subsequently came into foster with me and was named April. Meanwhile her owners had been found but were not in a position to give her the



aftercare she needed and signed her over to Last Chance Hotel. April suffered a few setbacks along the way and we fell in love with her so decided she would not be leaving our care. That was the start of me becoming the "crazy cat lady" for LCH.

A huge run was built in my garden so the cats can have 24 hour outdoor access without the risk of being run over.

Next to join us was Tony Boots (aka LGF) and Maisy cat with her 3 beautiful kittens. Maisy still lives with us but all her kittens found loving homes.

Coming up to Christmas in 2017 we received a call to help a lady and her daughter who were the victims of a devastating house fire and they needed a foster home for their beautiful cat Biscuit; she stayed with us over Christmas and went back to her family when they were settled in their temporary accommodation.

I currently have 9 cats in my care and that includes David the Cat!!!



David – hmmm, this boy has got himself quite a following on Facebook with his antics, thieving and generally making a nuisance of himself. David came into our care as a stray that a lady had been feeding for some months; he had a poorly ear that needed surgery, so LCH took him under our wing and got him the treatment needed and he is now a permanent member of our household. I'm not quite sure what I did to deserve him though, he may be popular with his fans, but they don't have to live with him!!! His buddy is Rigsby the Tortoise, who appears to have a similar attitude to his furry friend.

All the cats rub along with each other and our three dogs, and sometimes help me with the LCH admin if they're in the mood. Cats are such beautiful creatures, with amazing individual personalities, not least David the hooligan.....

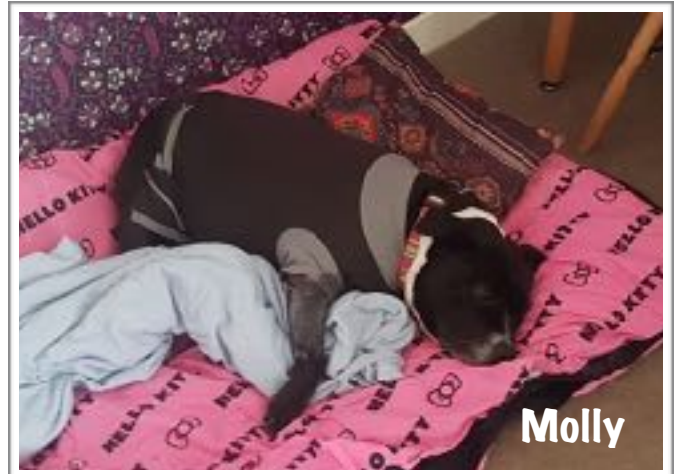

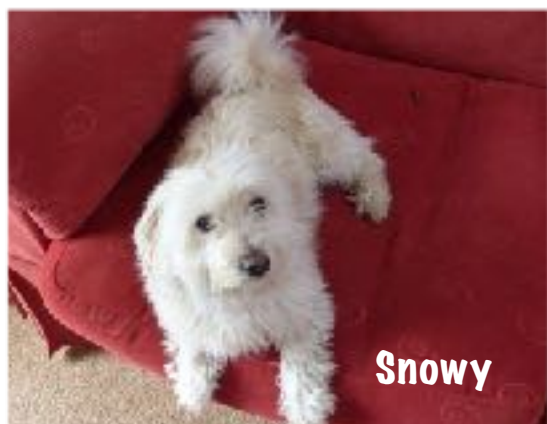
Waggy Tail Endings

Rescues Revisited

We love to hear from our adoptive families, and every so often will feature a story or two from them

Some of you may remember Henry, a poundie who came into rescue back in October 2017, just 3 years old and disabled with very wobbly back legs. We thought he deserved a chance of life, and thankfully so did Andrew and family, who took this gorgeous boy on as an end of life foster and have loved and cared for him ever since. Here is Henry's story....



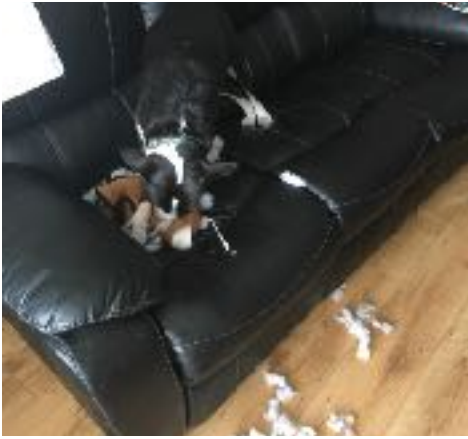
It was over a year ago when we got the call, a young dog needed fostering in a quiet, calm place as he had a serious back problem and could we take him. We had just lost another foster dog the week before who had a back problem so we knew what to expect and said yes. 30 minutes later we had a very nervous, very chatty staffie cross sat on my wife's lap. His back legs were very wobbly and would shake constantly.



Henry was supposed to go in the crate for his own safety as no one at the time knew how serious his spinal problem was. I put the bed in the crate, encouraged Henry in and he settled down for a few seconds only to come out and try and get on the sofa, this happened several times more and I gave up when I looked round to see our other dog settling down for a nap in the crate and Henry looking very content on the sofa. Henry wasn't sure on walks at first, his tail was well and truly between his legs and he was constantly looking around nervously. It wasn't long before he was sniffing, tail out, enjoying the fresh air.

Over the next few weeks Henry was assessed by the vet and taken to Somerset for an MRI. The outcome wasn't great with his back and maybe some brain damage as the vet thought he might have been hit quite hard on his head and the decision was taken to make the remainder of Henry's life as enjoyable and pain free as we could, showering him with the love and affection he deserved. Our grumpy old Jack Russell even chipped in, constantly licking Henry's ears and face. At first Henry didn't know what to do but now just sits back and enjoys the attention.





So now we have this crazy, lovable dog, several teeth missing and chatty as anything, loving life to the best of his ability, wrapping my wife and I around his little finger, taking up most of the sofa and the bed. He is allowed to be let off the lead every couple of months and makes the most of it, we take him to the dog paddock at Chapel Farm* where he spends the time chasing our older dog around like a maniac.

Most days though he is not a morning dog and isn't happy going out or getting up before one in the afternoon. Then all bets are off as to what you get, - normal chilled out day, or a manic, playing and 'chewing anything he can get his paws on' day including a handbag and a couple of shoes. And you had better be ready because if you ignore him he will let you know. We have several holes where he has chewed into our plasterboard walls as proof!

We have had our scares too with his pain meds having to be adjusted as time goes on, just a reminder to us that Henry may have a shorter journey than we had hoped but for now he is happy as Larry, laying on his back with his legs in the air on the sofa that he has made his home, with that mischievous look in his eye waiting for everyone else to come home for the fun to start.

My story by Bruno (age 19)

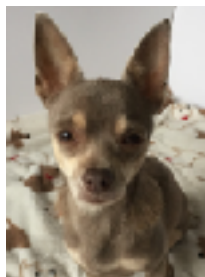

BATS

We were hoping for an in depth article for this issue from Sam on the rehabilitation of bats, but due to breaking her knee badly, this has had to be shelved until further notice. Several bats have come into the care of the Sanctuary recently, especially with the recent warmer weather, which is waking them earlier from hibernation than is usual. Unfortunately there is very little for them to eat at this time of year, so they are often malnourished. Two such little ones came in recently, both pictured here; one, a Brown Long-eared bat, - injured, possibly mauled by a cat, and a little Pipistrelle, a bit thin and weak. (Bat fact: Pips only weigh around 5 grams, about the same as a 20p piece) They and the other bats are now in the care of Chris and Sue Harlow. These bat experts have been rehabilitating bats for some time and were due to retire, with Sam taking over the reins, having learned so much from them. They have also taught theory and handling to some of our volunteers (Dave, Laura, Carla, Andrew, Roxy, and Paul the Vet). Thank you Chris and Sue for all your help, and also Louisa, Fiona, Andrew and Tori for helping out with picking up the bats and delivering them to their safe place with Sue.
