Emergency Call

At the beginning of January, Sam was asked by another rescue for help in transporting some pound dogs at very short notice. This is how Cathy tells it:

"I would like to say a massive big fat thank you to Last Chance Hotel Rescue who are making a MAMMOTH road trip from way down in Cornwall today for me to save THE LIVES OF MY POUNDIES. We thought we had the run



covered but poor Sue's van is off the road. We had poundies in crates at home to save them in last 2 days and no kennels at all. I WAS STRANDED. I remembered Sam saying if I was stuck to get in touch, so I messaged her and she and her fab co-driver have sprung into action. The Last Chance Hotel team are doing this regularly TO SAVE LIVES AND WORK TOGETHER WITH POUNDS AND OTHER RESCUES!!! Today we see THREE rescues and TEAM POUNDIE come TOGETHER to get these dogs out alive. Lives will not be lost today thanks to this wonderful rescue who are driving from Cornwall to Harrogate via Nottingham to save lives and that is all! XXXXXXX Love to you Sam S, Joanne B for offering spaces and to Sam, Selena, Theresa, Jo and all Last Chance Hotel Team who are doing and organising this amazing run!" Cathy Holding

Sam and Jo clocked up 900 miles in one day on this transport run. At one of the pounds they came across a lurcher boy with no name, frail and unwell. They couldn't possibly leave him there in a cold kennel, so he joined them on their trip home to Cornwall.

This sweet boy now has a name, Piper, given to him by a lovely lady. He is recovering slowly, still under vet supervision but he is warm, loved, and having lots of cuddles. And that is what it's all about.


January Fundraisers
